St Neot Footpaths

Rights of Way

I have been working slowly on the St Neot footpaths, as a member of our local environmental group Re-Imagine Kernow, and on behalf of St Neot Parish Council, and Cormac—I am a registered and approved volunteer with Cormac.

The Two Valleys route is pretty well sorted now—the only remaining work is on the stone steps up (or down) the hedge near Trenant. We have put the extra rail in place at the top, which makes it safer, especially for children, and in time we will put another rail in place. There is a plan for a bottom step here to prevent having to climb up onto the existing first step. The Cormac engineer will help us with this, when the water level drops in late spring.

Goonzion is now properly signed, as is Berry Down, and the access to the walk from near Tremarkyn, to Pen an Vownder has been cleared. There are a few walks which are currently blocked by landowners, and it is not easy to see how or if they can be resolved. There are also some which invade privacy to an unacceptable degree, and need sensible workarounds. Unfortunately this is an expensive process for the landowner; not a good state of affairs.

There is a right of way currently blocked by dense undergrowth, and I would appreciate some help with clearing it. A couple of people with brushcutters would do the job. If you can help would you get in touch? You can phone me 01579 320683, or email jennyhart316@gmail.com or make contact through Facebook. I have had lots of volunteer help in the past with surveying these routes - thank you all again for that - any further help would be much appreciated!

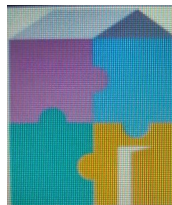

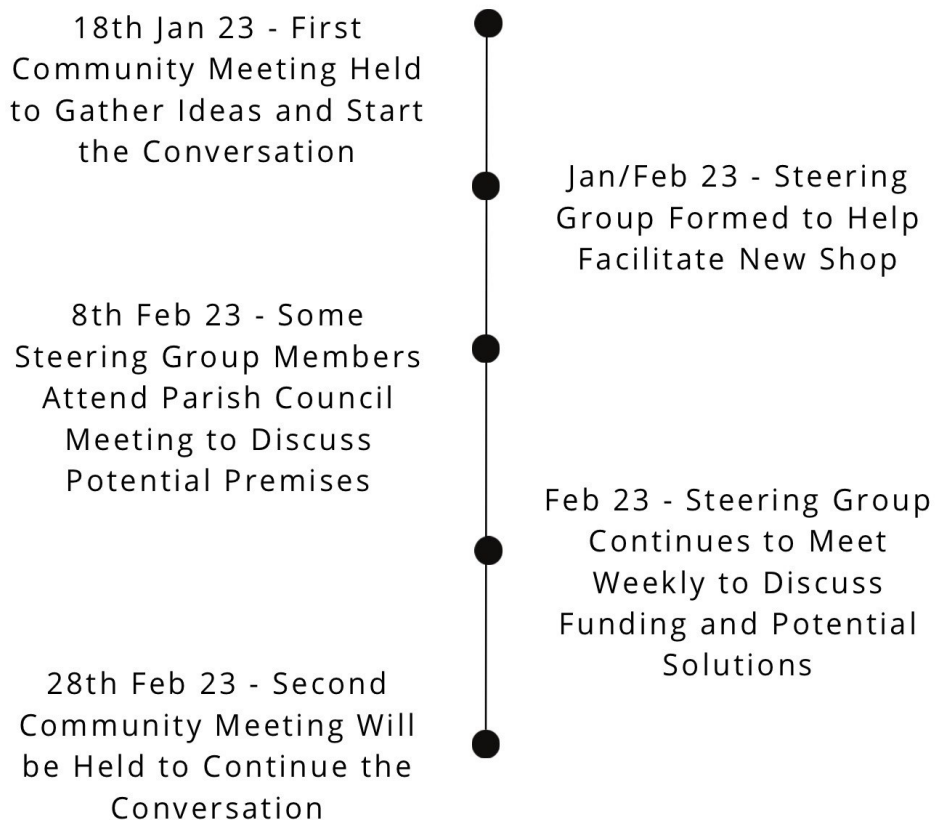

St Neot Historians held their AGM and first monthly meeting on Monday February 6th in the Methodist Chapel School Room. Over twenty people attended the short business portion of the evening's event. The positions of President, Jill Thomas; Chairman, Martin Eddy; Secretary, Chris Timms and Treasurer, Phil Martin were confirmed and agreed.

Our talk was given by Mike Haywood who enlightened us about "Aspects of the Inequality of Women through the Ages". Mike highlighted to us 1000 years of outright women's inequality since the Norman invasion, the religious roots of gender inequality, witch-hunts, medical bias against women from the 17th century, impact on genealogical research, and the high number of women in Victorian Lunatic Asylums.

Next year's programme was confirmed and discussed. We will be entertained in March by a flat screen version of "Letters from Australia" and in April learn about the history of Polperro as revealed by Artists. A trip around Liskeard with Brian Oldham will be our May event, in June we will visit Temple and the Moor.

Our Summer BBQ is in July this year and in August we will travel in time from St Neot (Celtic) to Medieval and back to Bronze Age at Berry Down. September we are back indoors with a talk about the land enclosure battles and commons registration. October sees us watching a "Film Night of the 1990s". At our November meeting Tasha Fullbrook will tell us what antiquities have been found in Cornwall and reported to the Portable Antiquities Scheme. Rector's Ramblings – From Pantomime to Lent

As the glamour and colours of the pantomime fade, Lent began on Ash Wednesday. In total contrast to the make-believe world of the panto, Lent seeks to bring us back to the rawness of human life. It continues through March until the end of Holy Week in April, and echoes the 40 days of self-reflection, which by tradition, Jesus spent in the wilderness before he began his ministry.

Originally Lent developed as a period of nurture and learning for new converts and who then became full members of the Church when they were baptized and confirmed on Easter Day. Over the years, it has become a time of reflection and redirection for Christians. A time for a sort spiritual “spring clean”.

In Lent, Ian Wheatley will be running a discussion group, entitled “What do you believe?” It will take place on Wednesday nights in the social club, and will begin on 1st March at 7.30pm. The details are given below. These relaxed sessions will run throughout Lent. Feel free to come to all, some or part of each session.

On the first Sunday in Lent we will have a service in the tradition of the Taizé Community in France, renowned for its work with young people, it's characteristic music and capacity to draw together people from across the world.

Mothering Sunday, on 19 March, otherwise known as Refreshment Sunday, marks the halfway point of the season, when we plan to hold another service focusing on families and children.

We have restarted Open the Book, which you may know, are bible story sessions for the children in the Primary School. We hope to run these a few times each term from 10-10.30am on a couple of Friday's each half term. If you would enjoy being part of this group and like telling stories to children, please let me know. Grandparents often tell a good story!

A really important date for your diary is Saturday 18th March, in the village hall in St Neot from 10 am -1pm, when we will be launching our MAP, a Mission Action Plan. A sort of 5 or 10 year plan. This will be a process which firstly involves taking an audit of the things we already do and do well, and then daring to dream what might be possible.

The relationship between the churches and our villages is very strong. But we do need to look to the future. Initiatives such as Village Brew and the cinema day, indicate what can be done. But we need to work hard to secure what we have and be assured of its place in the lives
